Recording Studio Final Project Assignment

Due Date: Tuesday, May 29

Demonstrate mastery of recording techniques and materials

The aim of this project is to allow you complete creative freedom to produce a song. There is a great deal of flexibility in terms of what you produce, but here are the parameters I would like you to follow:

- You must create a detailed recording plan and hand it in by Monday, May 7
 - That plan must include details about what song (if it's a cover if original, say so) you are recording, what instruments you plan to use, what microphones you intend to use, and any effects you think you might want
 - You may end up straying from your plan, but you should hand it in with the idea that you will definitely be following it.
- Your recording must use at least one live instrument (or voice) and at least one MIDI instrument (an existing loop or a recording you create using the keyboard)
- Your recording must use at least one effect on at least one track
- Your recording must be at least 1 minute long
- Reflection: Please also hand in a written reflection answering the following questions:
 - How did you envision your project sounding? How does it differ from your original idea?
 How is it the same?
 - In what ways did you diverge from your original recording plan? Why did you diverge?
 - What were two different challenges you faced during the process, and how did you resolve them (be very detailed!)?
