Spectrum Course Expectations

Course title: Spectrum

Course Description: Spectrum is PVPA's high-level vocal performing ensemble specializing in a cappella (voice alone) arrangements of all different styles of music. If you want to push your vocal capabilities to their maximum, then this class is for you. Explore tight vocal harmonies, complex rhythms, and advanced vocal techniques in PVPA's premier vocal ensemble. Students are expected to take the class both semesters.

Materials: 3-ring Binder (1-inch is big enough), blank notebook paper, pencil

Course Objectives: By the end of the course, students are expected to:

- Execute healthy physical technique and ensemble performance in a variety of settings and styles and can make appropriate changes in response to teacher, peer, and self-assessment
- Function as a member of an ensemble, making meaningful contributions to the work (e.g. preparation, set-up and break-down of equipment, artistic, aesthetic, expressive, reflection, following performance timelines, attending all rehearsals and performances, being on time and leaving only after breakdown is complete)
- Show evidence of personal growth in the areas of stage presence/confidence, and the ability to minimize the impact of stage/performance anxiety
- Demonstrate level-appropriate musical literacy (through completion of reading, writing, and dictation exercises for rhythms and notes)
- Demonstrate level-appropriate literacy in my score reading and interpretation (vocabulary, vertical and horizontal reading, recognition of symbols and directions)
- Demonstrate level-appropriate understanding of technical vocabulary as it relates to the vocal anatomy and vocalization.
- Identify and illustrate common principles, shared vocabulary, and connections between music, music of different genres, the arts and other disciplines (history, ELA, science & math)

Habits of Work and Learning (HOWLs): Students in this course should adhere to the following school-wide expectations:

- <u>Preparation</u>: I am prepared for class and arrive on time with organized materials and any needed attire.
- <u>Participation</u>: I participate in my learning by engaging actively, contributing productively, and collaborating respectfully and safely.
- <u>Personal Responsibility</u>: I manage my school work by monitoring my assignment completion, meeting deadlines for assigned work and revisions, and/or successfully navigating the extension process if necessary.

Units and Assessments: The course will be divided into the following units:

Extensions: Extensions will only be granted to students in good standing in the course (i.e. students who have consistently met the expectations outlined in the school-wide HOWLs). If a student cannot complete an assignment in time due to illness or another valid conflict, they must provide a written note from a parent/guardian and make arrangements with the course instructor in a timely fashion. If an assignment is handed in late without a student having been

granted an extension, the assignment cannot earn a grade of Exemplary. Extensions cannot be granted for performances. **See Missing Rehearsal Form.**

Revisions: Revisions will only be accepted if a student is has turned in a good-faith effort on a project by the assigned deadline and is in good standing in the course (i.e. students who have consistently met the expectations outlined in the school-wide HOWLs). Revisions must be completed and turned in by the assigned deadline. Revisions will not be accepted after the end of the term unless the student and the instructor have made different previous arrangements. Revisions will be required of works that receive a "beginning" grade, and highly recommended to "developing" projects. The final grade for an assignment will be representative of the revised, final draft that a student turns in, and of the progress made since earlier drafts of the work. Revisions cannot be granted for performances. **See Missing Rehearsal Form.**
